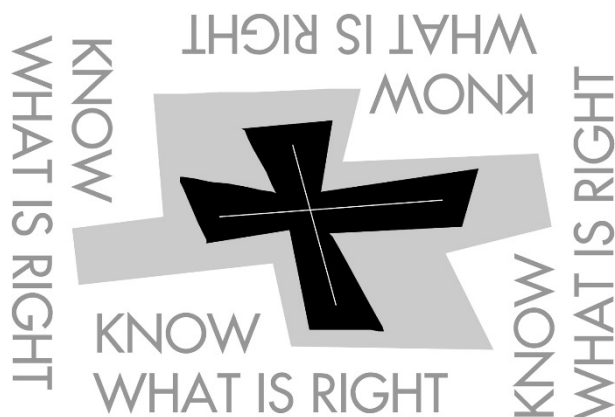

Family Promise of Morris County, Inc. is a non-sectarian, not-for-profit organization dedicated to ending the crisis of homelessness faced by Morris County families, by partnering with other public and private agencies, religious congregations and community volunteers to provide shelter, case management and mentoring services leading to self-sufficiency. Family Promise currently partners with more than 75 congregations of different faiths and 1600 of their congregants to provide shelter, overnight staffing, dinner and breakfast to our families. Family Promise of Morris County maintains a Day Center and Office in Parsippany. The dedication and commitment of all these partners makes Family Promise of Morris County the most cost-effective local shelter program in the

community. The volunteers and their families open their congregations, their schedules, their wallets, and their hearts to the families of Family Promise of Morris County. In addition, they allow the families to stay for as long as they need to get back on their feet. For some families, it may be a couple of weeks; for others, it may be a year. Many traditional shelters have a time limit which means families often have to find other temporary shelter before they have accumulated enough resources or completed necessary schooling to enable them to successfully move on to independent housing.
