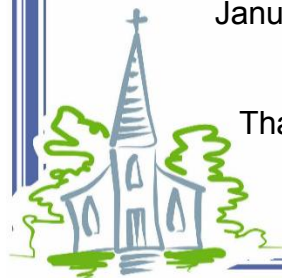

Christopher House Repair ~ We Need Your Help! The Christopher House has been undergoing repair since last February when a

broken waterline caused extensive damage to the building. While insurance is covering the cost of most of those repairs, the house also needs some additional repairs and improvements to prevent a similar disaster from occurring again and to make it a more usable and accessible meeting space. We are upgrading the heating system, replacing all the galvanized pipe with copper and installing a handicap-accessible bathroom and ramps, as well as numerous other structural and cosmetic repairs. The estimated cost to complete this project is \$70,000. These repairs are not covered by insurance. We need your help to restore the Christopher House. "If circumstances suggest it, the celebration of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick can be preceded by the Sacrament of Penance." (1140, *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*)
