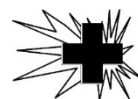

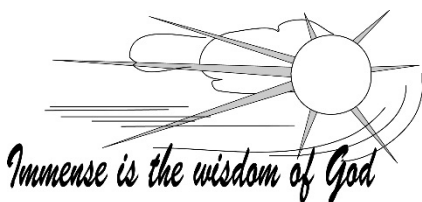
Grade 7 will attend the 9:00 a.m. liturgy on Wednesday.

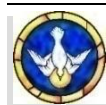
opening prayer for a special age - appropriate liturgy and reflection. The children will rejoin the congregation after the homily.
